## **Basic Information**

Reports will contain students' full name, registration group, house points achieved and attendance data (present, absent and lates). Authorised and unauthorised absences are displayed as sessions (morning and afternoon). One full day off would appear on the report as two absences.

## Standard of Attainment Grades

Student work is regularly assessed throughout the year, in each subject. Once a term a holistic grade is awarded; this grade is based on all the work a student has completed to date. During Key Stage 3 the students acquire the skills, knowledge and understanding that is needed in preparation for GCSE study. Please refer to the departmental pages on the curriculum section of the website (<u>https://www.kechg.org.uk/main-school/curriculum/departments</u>) to see individual subject grade descriptors. Reference to these will also provide specific subject information about what the students need to master in order to achieve a higher grade. Students' grades should improve during Key Stage 3 so that they are ready to study their GCSE subjects in Year 10.

# The Standard of Attainment grades are not equivalent to GCSE grades and it is likely that students who have achieved Grade 7 at the end of Year 9 will not achieve as highly at the start of Year 10.

### Expected Grade Matrix

The below matrix highlights how students will be working towards developing the skills, knowledge and understanding in preparation for GCSE study. The majority of students will achieve end of year grades within the indicated range.

Please remember that these are *holistic* grades based on all the work they have completed to date. It is <u>not</u> a grade on a single piece of work/assessment.

### Progress

The progress of a student is identified as the following symbols: +, =, -

Above expectations (+)	Student progress is currently above expectations if they are doing everything asked of them to the best of their ability and/or they have improved by more than one grade since the last report.
In line with expectations (=)	Student progress is currently in line with expectations if they are doing the majority of what is asked of them to the best of their ability and/or they have improved by one grade since the last report. We expect the majority of students to be in line with expectations, across the majority of their subjects.
Below expectations (-)	Student progress is currently below expectations if they are regularly not completing work to an appropriate standard and/or their grades are not improving as the year progresses.

## Aspects of Learning

Students are awarded a colour coded grade "Excellent", "Good", "Satisfactory" or "Needs Improvement" on the following criteria:

- Attitude to Learning Teachers will take into account how well students' work meets expectations in terms of detail and accuracy. They will consider students' organisation and how effectively they take responsibility for their own learning, particularly in responding to feedback.
- **Contribution to Lessons** Teachers will consider how well students participate in lesson-based discussion. They will reflect on students' participation in presentations, collaborative tasks, leading parts of lesson activities, asking questions, and offering answers to questions in class.

Excellent	Students work/behaviour is always at the highest standard in this aspect. Where an aspect of learning is "Excellent", please take the opportunity to praise your child for this aspect of their work.
Good	Students work/behaviour is usually at the highest standard in this aspect or always at least good. Where an aspect of learning is "Good", please take the opportunity to praise your child for this aspect of their work.
Satisfactory	Students work/behaviour is sometimes at the highest standard in this aspect or always at least satisfactory. Where an aspect of learning is "Satisfactory", this is an area to focus on particularly if the other aspects are green or yellow. Please look at the information below and discuss with your child what they can do to make the necessary changes to their learning habits to lead to improved grades and progress.
Needs	Students work/behaviour is frequently below the expected standard. Where an aspect of
Improvement	learning "Needs Improvement", please look at the information below and discuss with your child what they can do to make the necessary changes to their learning habits to lead to improved
