# ENRICHMENT WEEK

Enrichment Week takes place annually at Camp Hill School for Girls. This year it is scheduled to run from **Tuesday 24th to Friday 27th June 2025**. (Sports Day, weather-dependent, is set to take place on Monday 23rd June 2025. During Enrichment Week, students enjoy an amazing and varied programme of enrichment and extracurricular activities, aimed at encouraging personal skills away from the classroom.



## KEY STAGE 3

In Year 7 students take part in STEAM, creative writing and Art workshops. They also have the opportunity to attend a residential trip with their peers. The purpose of the visit is to enable students to work on a variety of cross curricular group and teamwork activities all based at Conover Hall, Shropshire. At Conover Hall, fully trained and qualified instructors, with the support of school staff, provide instruction in a full programme of activities in a safe, controlled and secure environment. Students can also take part in the Bikeability scheme throughout the week.

In Year 8 there is daily activities to Dovedale to work on their team work and explore the outdoors. Students will also have the opportunity to attend creative writing classes, enjoy a murder mystery activity and attend an Apprenticeship lecture from our very own staff, to inspire and educate students on future careers, opportunities and pathways.

Year 9 students take part in a range of activities throughout the week involving fashion design, the challenge carousel and an amazing opportunity to visit Oxford. Whilst in Oxford students will attend the Pitts River Museum, National History Museum and Keble College's Open Day. Later in the week students will add another fascinating museum to their repertoire with a trip to the National Memorial Arboretum.



## KEY STAGE 4

Finishing off the fulfilled week with an opportunity to visit Drayton Manor, a way to fight fears, enjoy some down time with peers and enjoy a well deserved, thrill seeking adventure.



## KEY STAGE 5

Year 12 students will have the opportunity to take part in a week of Work Experience during Enrichment Week.

There will be workshops available in school for students who need support with their UCAS personal statements. These will be run in school and supported by members of staff, with years of experience.

Students will also have the opportunity to support the running and set up of Sports Day and other workshops for Key Stage 3 and Key Stage 4.

In 2024 the opportunity to attend an Ackers (dry ski slope) session for the day was also available.
